Mrs Popeda has led phonics interventions in Year 2 and Year 3, three times a week!




Power of Reading

These documents are for the children and adults to use during learning time.


It outlines the words, types of sentences, and punctuation and types of text the children must learn for that year group.

Spellings

Read, Write Inc Spellings scheme is continued to be taught in Years 3-6




Common Exception Words: On a half termly basis, children are tested on how to spell the common exception words. At the end of the year, children are

tested on how to spell every single common exception word!

Handwriting

The children learn letter formation through the Penpals scheme.







In Year 3, we had adapted the handwriting sessions to meet the needs of the class and invested in the Bubble handwriting scheme as children required a further level of scaffolding.

Reading

Weekly CGP Reading comprehension tasks in Y3-5

The school introduced weekly comprehension which helped children learn how to answer comprehension questions and gain a better understanding of what was being asked, how to find evidence in the text and how to use quotes from the texts to support their answers.







NFER termly comprehension test

More robust tests of children's comprehension were introduced which enabled staff to dig deeper into understanding a child's level of understanding by completing question level analysis.


World Book Day



Extra Writing Info from St Mary's Hampton School

We invested in small group interventions to take place in Y4-6 to support children with their writing. These sessions were run by Ms Stanton.
