Years 3 and 4 have made significant progress in French speaking, listening, and writing across various topics. In the module "Getting to Know You," students learned how to introduce themselves and engage in simple conversations with their peers. They were able to express their likes and preferences in the "All About Me" module. Exploring the theme of "Food Glorious Food," students learned vocabulary related to food and how to describe meals.

- In the module "Getting to Know You," children focused on developing their conversational skills and learned how to introduce themselves, ask and answer questions about personal information, and engage in basic social interactions. They practiced greetings, expressions of courtesy, and simple dialogues to enhance their communication abilities.
- In the module "All About Ourselves," years 5 and 6 delved deeper into self-expression and self-description. They learned how to talk about their physical appearance, personality traits, likes, and dislikes. Through interactive activities, role-plays, and written exercises, children gained confidence in expressing themselves in French.
- The module "That's Tasty" introduced children to the vocabulary related to food and eating. Years 5 and 6 explored various French dishes, traditional meals, and dining etiquette. They learned how to discuss their favorite foods, describe flavors, and express preferences. Through listening exercises and discussions, children expanded their knowledge of the French culinary culture.



Across KS2



In the module "Let's Visit a French Town," years 5 and 6 learned vocabulary related to places in a town, such as the bakery, the market, the park, and the train station. They practiced giving and following directions, and engaged in simulated conversations to navigate the town. This module helped students develop their listening comprehension skills and their ability to communicate in real-life situations.

During the module "Let's Go Shopping," years 5 and 6 focused on developing their vocabulary and language skills related to shopping. They learned how to describe clothing items, ask for prices, and make purchases. Students engaged in role-plays, dialogues, and written exercises to reinforce their knowledge of shopping vocabulary and enhance their language fluency.

Lastly, in the module "This is France," years 5 and 6 explored the geography, history, and culture of France. They learned about famous landmarks, traditional celebrations, and important historical figures. Through reading, listening, and research activities, students deepened their understanding of French culture and developed their writing skills to express their knowledge and opinions.
