James said 'I liked learning the songs because they told the story of Christmas.'


## **Spring**

Year 4 learned and performed a superb play which brought the Easter story to life. We walked down to St. Mary's Church for the Easter Service.


Grace said 'I know so much more about the Easter story now we have watched Year 4 do their show.'
